We have important news to share with you about your prescription drug coverage. Your prescription drug plan is changing. On December 31, 2014 your current coverage with Express Scripts Prescription will end. You will automatically be enrolled in a new plan.

We are working with UnitedHealthcare® to offer UnitedHealthcare® MedicareRX for Groups (PDP) plan, underwritten by UnitedHealthcare Insurance Company, UnitedHealthcare insurance Company of New York, (for NY residents), for your prescription drug coverage.
